MINOR SORE THROAT PAIN

Most sore throats are viral in origin and lead to localized throat pain with irritated and raw mucosa. Swallowing causes friction between irritated mucous membranes and may intensify the discomfort.

ThroatCalm® Spray targets **localized pain** associated with **occasional minor sore throat by delivering homeopathic active ingredients directly to the affected area**. Its emollient properties provide relief without numbing the throat or affecting the gag reflex. ThroatCalm Spray is not a counterirritant that could delay proper healing and is free of numbing agents that may mask symptoms of a more serious condition.

As a spray, ThroatCalm delivers the medicine precisely to the back of the throat. Medication from conventional lozenges and strips reaches this key area only when the patient swallows – a process that can be painful. Additionally, this form proves more practical and portable than gargles and does not require rinsing of the mouth.

ThroatCalm Spray contains the natural flavor L-Carvone, which has an herbal mint-like taste compatible with the use of homeopathic medicines. It may be used in conjunction with ThroatCalm sublingual tablets or pellets, indicated for occasional minor sore throat, overexertion of the vocal cords, and hoarseness.

Medicines in the ThroatCalm line are available over the counter and health care professionals can also purchase direct from Boiron.

PHARMACOLOGY

Its active ingredients are made according to the **Homeopathic Pharmacopoeia of the United States**, the official compendium recognized by the **Food and Drug Administration**.⁴

Indications for homeopathic medicines have been determined experimentally and verified by years of empirical use by thousands of physicians. Insight into these traditional indications is gained throughout the years as advances are made in the fields of biochemistry and pharmacology.
